This may include testifying before Congress, appearing on radio and television, preparing press advisories, reaching out to journalists to communicate the positions of the Foundation, and organizing and speaking at Foundation-hosted events.

As Vice President and Senior Fellow, the successful candidate will also be responsible, along with the President, for maintaining broad financial support for the organization across a wide array of constituencies. The Vice President reports to the President of the Foundation.

- Serving as a senior executive official of the Foundation and playing a management and leadership role both internally and externally
- Enhancing the already prestigious reputation of the Free State Foundation and helping to provide a continuing vision for the organization's third decade and beyond
- Keeping abreast of technological, legal, and regulatory changes in the communications policy, Internet, and intellectual property areas
- Developing FSF expertise and projects in new areas adjacent to its current core expertise, such as, for example, AI, antitrust and competition law, energy, and transportation.
- Establishing yourself as a thought leader regarding free market, free speech, and rule of law issues, especially relating to communications law and policy, protection of intellectual property rights, and administrative law reform
- Conceiving, organizing, and bringing to fruition FSF projects and activities
- Producing significant scholarly work relating to FSF's primary issue areas
- Supervising and guiding FSF staff, adjuncts, and academic advisors in accomplishing the Foundation's work, including closely and substantively editing drafts
- Serving as a Foundation spokesperson to advance and explain the Foundation's work
- Assisting in the Foundation's efforts to raise financial support

- Some degree of prior experience and expertise in the communications law and policy, Internet, high-tech, intellectual property, or related areas
- A demonstrated interest and ability to contribute FSF's publications output by virtue of possession of excellent research and writing skills as well as editing skills
- The ability, working with the President, to formulate requests for FSF financial support and to ask supporters and potential supporters for major contributions
